Books of Prophecy #2 Exile Period

Again the last grouping in the Old Testament is the Books of Prophecy. There are 3 sections that make up the Books of Prophecy. The 2nd of the three sections of the Books of Prophecy is the Exile Period. This is the smallest group of prophets including only two of the Major Prophets;

Ezekiel

Daniel

Ezekiel and Daniel are in exile in a foreign land, Babylonia, around 600-500 B.C. historically speaking, these prophetic books are about the time period between 2 Chronicles and Ezra.

God's sovereignty is at the heart of these prophetic books!

These books are apocalyptic writings, primarily a literature of encouragement to the people of God. Its center is the unfolding of God's saving purposes and His redemptive plan being played out through the history of man. God's instrument of time is just a tool by which he plays out His purpose. Remember too that these are listed as Major Prophets mainly because of the size of their writings, so chronologically speaking in the order of books listed in the Holy Bible, they come just after the other two Major Prophets from the previous time period namely Isaiah and Jeremiah with Lamentations being Jeremiah's second book.

How to remember this section:

Section #2 of Books of Prophecy take place during the exile period and it has only 2 prophets. They are Major Prophets led by the older **Ezekiel** and the younger prophet, **Daniel**. Section 2 has 2 prophets! The chronology of the Holy Bible has these two Major Prophets following the two Major Prophets of the Pre-Babylonian Exile (section #1 of Prophecy) prophets Isaiah & Jeremiah, then comes the Minor Prophets of Section #1.

> Ezekiel – takes place from 597-574 B.C. From the nation of Judah, Ezekiel was exiled to Babylon by Nebuchadnezzar after Daniel in 597 B.C. during the siege of Jerusalem. Jerusalem was later destroyed in 586 B.C. He was an older priest-prophet, yet a contemporary of a young Daniel. It is in Babylon where Ezekiel received his calling to become a prophet. The book of Ezekiel contains more dates than any other prophetic book which allows for considerable precision in dating events. His calling as a priestly prophet was for only 22 years from 593 B.C. to 571 B.C.

The Book of Ezekiel has two distinct parts:

- 1. Oracles of Judgment against Israel & other nations Ezekiel 1-32.
- 2. Oracles of Consolation for Israel Ezekiel 32-48.

With great symmetry, the book of Ezekiel balances the divine judgment of God with His redemption in the new age to come.

 <u>Daniel</u> – takes place from 607-534 B.C. It is set during the Babylonian captivity, a period when Jews were deported and exiled to Babylon. A young Daniel was deported around 607 B.C. The book revolves around the prophet, Daniel, an Israelite who becomes an adviser to Nebuchadnezzar, the ruler of Babylon.

The book has two distinct parts:

- 1. A series of six narratives from Daniel 1-6.
- 2. And four apocalyptic visions from Daniel 7-12.

The dating and authorship of Daniel has become a matter of debate. The traditionalist view holds that the work was written by a prophet named Daniel who lived during the sixth century B.C. His incredible accuracy in prophetic statements brings about doubters of his authorship. However, no sufficient reasoning exists for this denial other than the questioning of God's Word as truth and Jesus Christ as the Messiah for He, Jesus Christ, concurred with Daniel's authorship in the book of Matthew from the New Testament (Matthew 24:15). The quiet time of the prophets around 400 B.C. up to the birth of Christ is given account in the Book of Daniel. Incredible detail into the history of man during this timeframe trips up many non-believers to this day. The Greek Empire is spoken of almost 200 years BEFORE its rise to power, and the subsequent, Roman Empire which takes over is brought up as well

The Book of Daniel is the trumpeting of the sovereignty of God throughout the history of man.

This is the smallest group of the OT sections in the Holy Bible. It contains only 2 books in all written by 2 of the Major Prophets. This time period is during the time of exile in Babylonia whereby the endeavor to assimilate the Israelites into the culture of Babylon was attempted.

(*Remember:* In the chronological order of books in the Holy Bible, these two books are after Lamentations which is the 2nd book of Jeremiah. But, for the memory of the flow of sections in the Holy Scriptures, they are kept in the flow of sections. Thus, they are put after the Minor Prophets of the Pre-Babylonian Exile Period.)
