Books of History #2

Pre-Kingdom Period

The next set of Books in the Holy Bible is the Pre-Kingdom Period of the Books of History. These books are also known as the Conquest Period. The Pre-Kingdom Period includes these three books:

- Joshua
- Judges
- Ruth

How to remember this section:

Moses dies at end of Pentateuch without entering the Promised Land. **Joshua** is the next leader of the Israelites leading them into the Promised Land. Thus the Book of Joshua is the next book heading the Pre-"King"dom era. This is the time before Israel had a king. Double J's **(Joshua & Judges)** followed by **Ruth** which takes place in the time of the judges.

- <u>Joshua</u> the 1st book after the Pentateuch. Led by Joshua, the Israelites now cross into the land that God promised to them. The 1st half of this book is about the conquest of the Promised Land around 1400 B.C. The 2nd half is about the settlement of the land among the twelve tribes. Victory comes from their <u>obedience</u> to God.
- <u>Judges</u> By contrast this book is about their <u>disobedience</u> and subsequent defeats. There are 12 judges during this time period (emphasis on the number 12); 6 major judges (Othniel, Ehud, Deborah, Gideon, Jephthah, and Samson) and 6 minor judges or deliverers (Shamgar, Tola, Jair, Ibzan, Elon, and Abdon). During these distinct cycles of disobedience to oppression to deliverance, the Israelites are given military champions to shed their bondage only to fall back into their sinful ways.
- Ruth This book is about a particular time period within the Judges timeframe. Ultimately, it is description of God's provision and sovereign plan for the genealogy of the Messiah and His redemptive plan through history. One of only two Biblical books named after a main character being a woman, Ruth being a Moabite woman shows that God's children are not decided by birth or blood, but by an obedience that comes from faith.

The timeframe spans more than 350 years from Moses to the 1st King of Israel, Saul in 1050 B.C.
