The Old Testament

Books of History #1 The Pentateuch

The first 5 Books of the Holy Bible are often called the Pentateuch with the pre-fix "Pent" emphasizing the number five. They are also called the Law, or the Torah. The Pentateuch includes:

- Genesis
- Exodus
- Leviticus
- Numbers
- **D**euteronomy

How to remember this section:

These 5 Books are the most widely known section of the Old Testament. Most people reading a book like the Holy Bible start in the beginning. That would be Genesis. Most may get to Exodus the 2nd book of the OT, but they soon stop reading at this point or move to another section so they are not as familiar with the remaining books of this section. The Pentateuch is the beginning account of history. The easiest way to commit things to memory is to use acronyms. So, $\mathbf{G} - \mathbf{E} - \mathbf{L} - \mathbf{N} - \mathbf{D}$ are the letters to remember ("gel – land"); Genesis (G), Exodus (E), Leviticus (L), Numbers (N), and Deuteronomy (D). Ultimately, if you learn the flow of the books, it will be much easier to remember their order. An acronym will get you started though.

• <u>Genesis</u> - the book of origins--of the beginning of life, and of ruin through sin.

(Chapters 1-11) are about the historical account of creation and the spreading of the nations. Based on the genealogical account given in the Holy Scriptures these chapters are about the time period from 4004 B.C. when creation began up thru Noah and the Tower of Babel to Abraham (Abram) in about 2166 B.C.

(Chapters 11-50) are about the history of God's people through the lives of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob ending with the death of Jacob's son, Joseph about 1805 B.C.

 <u>Exodus</u> - Almost 300 years have past, it is now around 1526 B.C., and Moses is born. This book gives account of Moses' story. It is the book of redemption with the first Laws given. It lays the foundation for worship and reverence for God. God's deliverance from Egypt takes place in this book. The Lord's standard is given with the Ten Commandments first dictated in Exodus 20.

- Leviticus the book of worship and communion. The 5 main offerings are explained along with moral laws and regulations concerning cleanness. The punishments for disobedience along with the blessings and curses. The name of the book comes from the Greek translation, "relating to the Levites" which were the priests divinely ordained. These laws were given during the year of encampment around Mount Sinai around 1445 B.C.
- <u>Numbers</u> speaks of the experiences of a pilgrim people, the redeemed being refined by God before entrance into the Promised Land. This book gives account of the 38-year account of Israel's wandering in the desert after the census was taken two years following the covenant given at Mt. Sinai. The chastening wrath of God against those that are disobedient is also described. It is now around 1406 B.C.
- <u>Deuteronomy</u> book of instruction for the redeemed about to enter that inheritance, second Laws given. They are not another set of Laws so much as a repetition of the Laws already given. Not much time has elapsed here; they are still in Moab just across the Jordan River with the Promised Land on the other side. A covenant renewal with God and His people. The Ten Commandments are restated in Deuteronomy 5. A love relationship pervades this book both from God's perspective and from an obedient people, the next generation. Moses' death concludes the Pentateuch with leadership being passed to Joshua.

The timeframe spans almost 2,600 years from Creation to the death of Moses.

This is the first section of books in the Holy Bible. There are 5 books: (remember "gel – land")
